### <u>Year 1 – Pendennis Castle</u>

Year 1 thoroughly enjoyed their trip to Pendennis Castle this

week despite the rain. At the start of the day, they were able to have some photos taken running on the grass with the castle behind by a professional photographer. They then went into the castle and learnt about King Henry VIII and why both

Pendennis Castle and St. Mawes Castle were built. The children pretended to be gunners scaring the King of France and Spain when they

decided to bring their boats to try and invade both castles. During the morning, they put their exploration skills to good use to discover and learn about the different wooden chests and their contents. Inside them were different means of light, different crockery and goblets for eating and drinking, feather quills and wax seals for letter writing and wooden splints and medicine bottles for making remedies to make people feel better. They were







then able to look at different costumes and dress up as a gunner, potboy, blacksmith and governor. After lunch the children

were able to explore the different levels of the castle, looking at all the canons and looking through the windows at the views and how the castle would have been protected. Great fun was had by all and Year 1 would like to say a massive thank you to our adult helpers who supported on this
